
#### Welcome to the Agape SML monthly newsletter! We're glad you're here.

## JUST IN TIME FOR THANKSGIVING!

At Agape, we see time and again that the Lord provides what we need when we need it. While we are blessed with so many donations, the approaching Thanksgiving holiday found us short of an important staple: potatoes! According to Judy Harper, Agape's Pantry Leader, "while we have had produce donated recently, we've not had potatoes for some time." On November 11, things changed! We received 815 pounds of potatoes, thanks to the generosity of two area gleaning teams. <u>The Christiansburg</u> <u>New River Valley Gleaners</u>, who sponsor the "potato drop," transported the potatoes to Trinity Ecumenical's gleaning team. Trinity then bagged them and shared with other regional and local organizations, including the Agape Center. This is such a great example of God's timing! It also underscores the valuable relationship among local and regional organizations cooperating to serve those in need in our community.





When we feel the hand of God impacting our lives, we want to share the experience. That was in Robin Leftwich's heart when she met recently with Agape mentor Karen Jones.

### **Feeling God's Presence**

#### ROBIN'S STORY

"I could feel God's presence at that scene and was so grateful," Robin said of the October night her grandson Jaheim survived a frightening car accident off Hwy 24.

Jaheim, who has lived with his grandmother Robin since he was small, fell asleep at the wheel when driving home on October 31. His car went down a ravine, splitting a tree in the descent.

"There was no way anyone could have seen the car from the road the way it landed," Robin said.

Miraculously surviving the crash, Jaheim was able to get out of the car and crawl to the top of the hill. His phone remained intact. He contacted 911, and his grandmother. When Robin arrived at the scene she said it was "calm, without panic" and the emergency services teams were kind and helpful.

Meeting with Karen on November 4, Robin described the incident, and the huge difference Agape has made for her family over the years – from clothing to food, and even helpful advice on how to apply for college loans.

She exclaimed how kind and truly genuine the volunteers are, and how she values the opportunity to pray with a mentor at every appointment. She is especially proud of Jaheim, a student at CVCC in Lynchburg.

Karen was delighted to join Robin in a prayer of praise to God for protecting him that evening!
